

UNCOMMON THREADS STANDARDS **Whidbey Weavers Guild Sale 2015**

The Whidbey Weavers Guild is comprised of very creative people encompassing many facets of fiber art. Our sale provides a platform for the diversity and originality of all guild members whether you display for sale a few items or many.

All Items are accepted in the sale per the following terms:

1. Items must be original work made by the WWG member.
2. All items must be for sale and we encourage all vendors to sell their items at a fair market price.
3. Items must be made using weaving, basketry, spinning, felting, fusion, handmade paper, dyeing, surface design, braiding, knitting, crocheting, tating, or other interlacement technique unless otherwise approved by the Standards Committee.
4. Sewing, quilting, beading and embroidery are accepted only in conjunction with the above techniques. A commercially made item is acceptable ONLY if a significant amount of interlacement handwork or embellishment is added that changes the item significantly and is approved in advance by the Standards Committee.
5. Members may sell packages not exceeding one pound of their clean animal fibers, roving or batts. No whole fleeces.
6. Items must meet minimum standards of quality, craftsmanship, presentability and finishing; items must be unused, undamaged, free from odors (mothball, tobacco, mildew, body, etc.), and be properly finished and clean. Commercial parts of items like pillow forms, must be of good quality.
7. Items can be for sale for three successive years only.
8. Pieces to be hung, must be ready for hanging.

WWG Standards Committee reserves the right to accept or reject items that do not meet the above criteria.

If you have items that you're not sure meet these Standards, please bring samples to the meetings for our review.
